Rear Fender and Bump Stop Project

Most of us are always trying to figure out ways to improve our vehicles in some way. This project has been on my list since I bought my 4Runner 2-1/2 years ago. The rear suspension up travel was very limited to keep the tires from rubbing on the fenders. When I was loaded down for an off road trip the rear suspension would bottom out on just about any bump when traveling over 15 MPH. Once we did make it to the trail and got into

low range I could feel that the rear suspension was limited and forcing the front suspension to do more of the articulating than it should have to.

This project kept getting pushed off because on the 4Runner the inner rear fender is double wall construction and the inner





part of the fender is inside the passenger compartment. This was going to take some online research, planning and a lot more time than an easy fender trim on a Toyota pickup bed.

My first step was to use the clubs RTI ramp and figure out how much up travel I wanted to try and get out of my rear leaf springs. I used that information and tried to figure out how much rear fender I needed to remove to get the amount travel I wanted and still have something left to stitch back together and look decent when I was done.

Once I had an idea of what I thought would work I removed the tire and tried to use it as a guide and design the new fender shape to get the most



clearance possible and cut the least amount off. With tape I set my cut lines 1" to 1-1/2" less than my finished shape and put a new blade on the 4-1/2" grinder and grabbed some ear plugs and safety glasses and when to work. My plan for the 1" to 1-1/2" was to fold that material and fold it under to help create the new inner fender well and stiffen up the body panel. The grinder worked well and I left the tight work and curves to right and left hand tin snips. I used two pair of duck bill vise grips to fold the body under as best as I could. The rest was left to hammer and dolly work to stretch the metal and get it as nice as I felt necessary. It is a trail rig after all not a sema show truck. Once I had things folded and shaped the best I could I ended up with a long triangle shaped hole in the new fender well. So with

thin cardboard in hand I made a template for each side and cut out some 16ga sheet metal to weld in. I touched everything up with a flap disk and some sand paper and painted it with

Dupli-color Perfect Match from summit racing.

Now that the fenders were done I cut off the factory bump stop with the added piece and removed the other plastic part from the axle side. With that out

of the way I use the travel measurements from the RTI ramp and tack welded in the new stops. Off to the ramp to check things. The bump stops made contact to soon. Knocked the stops off and cut 1" off, tack welded them back on and back to the ramp (always better to be two long than two short). Second try looks good time to finish weld and paint.

My up travel before I started was about 2-3/4" and it was a very hard sold plastic piece with no cushion. Now that the project is done I have 4" before the bump stop hits and my new soft slotted polyurethane bump stops compress around 2" for a much improved rear suspension ride and performance on the trail.




helped Kenn out. We headed back to the Lodge for dinner and some heat.

Andrew pulled up at the right time and we headed to the turnoff for Bald Mountain. We arrived at about 10 and headed in. The weather was warm and clear and just a great day.

The snow was at least 3' deep and packed.

On the way in we passed a Yota parked on the side of the road with a large amount of empty beer bottles in the back. When we got to the left turn for Bald Mountain there were a few people taking a break so we headed on in. 




Trip Reports:
