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### Coyote Lake Run


Kirk and Ingrid headed over to Shaver Lake Friday morning. Kenn and I got away at about 2:30 Friday afternoon. We stopped in Prather for dinner and got a call from Kirk. We agreed to meet at the snow park at Tamarack Summit. We were surprised at the number of people at the snow park but with the Cal-4Wheel Poker Run and deer hunting season I guess it is understandable.

Kirk and Ingrid were already there and had unloaded and set up camp. We did the same and sat and visited until time to hit the sack. There was a lot of vehicles coming through all night and not very aware that some of us were trying to sleep but that's the way it goes. Saturday morning we got up and got set to head out. Kirk had to run into Shaver for fuel so Kenn and I finished up and were ready to go. Kirk came back with fresh coffee and we

headed out. There was lots of people camping and driving on the road from the snow park to the turn off for Swamp.



When we arrived at the trail head we aired down and I lifted my hood to investigate a knock against my firewall I heard coming in. We found both my front shock shafts had pulled out of the bottom shock bracket. I removed both shocks and away we went. There were several hunters driving along the side of the road so we had to be wary until we got to where the trail was getting a little more off road. We didn't see any hunters after that but we did see some deer. Funny how they seem to know!

It was a beautiful day and the trail was fun. We passed a group that included 3 1st. gen. Ford Bronco's and 1 Jeep. All were well built with big v-8's. As we were climbing the last hill before the top of the ridge, Kirk's truck quit running. By now the Broncos had caught up to us so the lead Bronco strapped up to Kirk and pulled him to the top. He struggled mightily but finally made it. We thanked them profusely and they went on their way.

Kirk, Kenn and I jumped on Kirk's truck and determined it was not get-

ting fuel. We dropped the tank and found the fuel pump on the bottom of the tank not attached to the intake tube. I had some fuel line so we cut a new piece and used 2 hose clamps for extra pressure. We put it back together and it fired right up. We weren't sure if we could make Swamp Lake before dark since we spent 3 hours with the repair but decided to go as far as we could and stop when we got tired. We headed out and made really good time even stopping for photo opportunities on Rooster Rock. We made swamp by 6:30 to 7. There was only 1 other group camping at Swamp so we had lots of choices as to where to camp. We had just enough time before dark to set up. camp. We had dinner and sat by the campfire (in a can) enjoying the company and the surroundings.

The next morning we found Kirks dog had gotten sick and didn't want to walk. After breakfast we kind of went our separate ways. Kenn went for a hike to Swamp Meadow with his two dogs. Kirk was going to drive up to the ridge between Grouse Lake and Swamp Lake to see if he could get cell service to call his Vet for any ideas as to what to do even though June, the dog, was doing better. I hiked up to the main trail to watch the rigs that

were on the poker run. I saw quite a few rigs and talked to several people. There was a surprising amount of rigs from San Luis Obispo County. When I got back to camp, Kirk's truck was not running again and he never made it up to the ridge.

After lunch, Kenn, Kirk and I tried to diagnose his truck problems. We felt it was not getting fuel again and I had an extra fuel pump so we dropped the tank and replaced it. It would not start. We flushed the fuel line and removed the filter and blew it out. We got some pretty bad stuff out but it still would not start. We worked until almost dark to no avail. We decided we had no choice but to tow him out the next day (Monday).

Monday we got up early grabbed a quick breakfast and broke camp. Kenn strapped to Kirk and I strapped to Kenn. We figured if we could get Kirk up the hill from swamp to the main trail, we would be successful getting him back to the snow park. We had no problems there so we headed out. We pulled, towed, winched and jerked for the next 10 hours. Before we got to Winch Hill we had to climb a pretty big rock garden which is also up a steep hill. I pulled cable and strapped to a tree at the top and between winch-

ing and towing we managed to make it.

Then we came to Winch Hill. I unhooked from Kenn and wheeled over the top. Then Kenn hooked cable and winched to me pulling Kirk until we got Kirk to the top. We struggled to get him over the top but finally made it. We popped the bead on 1 of Kirk's tires but Kenn pulled out his tank and it filled back up. We spent almost two hours getting over Winch Hill and were pretty tired but continued on.

The rest of the way had some rough spots but we managed pretty well. We thought we were home free as we were not too far from the end of the trail and the gate. By now the trail is just steep switch backs of dirt and some loose material. We were going around a sharp turn. I looked in my left Mirror and Kenn was in good shape. I looked away for a minute and looked in my right mirror and Kenn was on two wheels. Before I could stop he went over and his 4Runner was on its side. He was smart about it and shut the engine off immediately. I pulled over to his side and we hooked a strap to his rock slider. I pulled him back on all 4's and we lifted the hood. He hadn't even lost any fluids from the engine. He gave everything the once over, started it and it ran fine with no smoke. He had some body damage and a cracked windshield but otherwise we were good.

We continued on our way and finally arrived at the snow park by 7:00. We winched Kirk on to his trailer and loaded our own rigs. Kirk and Ingrid had reservations at Dinkey Creek Camp Grounds and Kenn and I headed home. We stopped again in Prather for dinner and got home around 1:00 A.M. Tuesday. Kenn and I agreed this was the most grueling difficult and learning off road trip we have had up to this date.

When we hit the rock garden and pinch point at Coyote here we both just picked our lines and went through without a glitch. I would say the trail is torn up from both rock bug-





gies and RZR's, but this does keep the challenge we want. We got into Coyote and set up camp on Booker point around 6:30 we with the small group we found at camp. Saturday morning I looked at the jeep and realized that the front revolver was destroyed and needed replaced. I had a spare shackled that would at least work to help get me out and Tom loaned me a ball peen hammer as my claw hammer just did not work well. Fixed the shackle and did not see any other issues and hiked to Perkins Meadow with the H's and Tom to meet the others all at Perkins. The meadow was drop dead beautiful and had plenty of water.

The kids fished and ate snacks and we headed back to camp in separate groups. Saturday night sat around the fire in the can as campfires are not permitted in the Forest with the high fire danger.
